Outreach Nov 2024 Update — Sher Harnish

Congratulations DQG!!!:

We exceeded our 2024 goal of 550 donated quilts! As of our November Meeting/Surplus Sale, we have donated 593 quilts to our various charity partners.

We added a new organization this year, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, which makes beds for children without their own; DQG donated 33 throw/twin sized quilts to SHP.

Along with large quilts for graduating seniors in foster care, and quilts for low income elderly through Hearts for Homes, we're making some larger quilts nowadays.

We also donated to Woman to Woman Resource Center for newborns, the CPS Rainbow Rooms where caseworkers can get clothing and other supplies for kids when they are first taken into care, National Adoption Day, military veterans through our two Quilts of Valor bees, Cumberland Youth and Family Services, nursing homes, and the animal shelter (75 fleece blankets, in addition to the total above).

To top it off, we donated 1750 Christmas stockings! It's possible we'll have a few more going out before the end of the year, but we try to complete our giving in November so agencies have what they need plus maybe some extra for holiday giving to their clients. Thanks again to everyone who gave of their time and talents to help provide comfort and color to others' lives.




