Don't forget to sign the snack contributor list on the table for a chance to win the snack table door prize—just for those who bring goodies!





# 2025 Guild Initiative - Pop Stick Block



This year we're making Pop-Stick blocks. Easy peasy black and white blocks with a pop of color. Plus you make two blocks at the same time! Make as many as you like, turn them in at any meeting or at Kid's Bee. A selection of B&W scraps is available at the Kids Kwilt table.

- Make two 13" scrappy blocks, using small to medium scraps of several different fabrics. Two blocks should be
  - One black with white patterns
  - One white with black patterns
- 2) Stack your blocks on top of each other, right sides up
- 3) Using your rotary cutter, make a diagonal slice through Both blocks, but <u>not on the true diagonal</u>, make your cut off center between any two opposing or adjacent sides. It can be a long or short slice. Stay 1" from the corners.
- 4) Cut 2 1 ½ " solid colored strips 3" longer than your slice. These strips should be WOF, not on the bias. Use flat solid or tone on tone fabrics that read as solid.
- 5) Unstack your slices and rearrange so that each block now has a dark side and a light side.
- 6) Align & sew the colored strips between the two opposing sides. Pin to keep the bias edges of the black and white triangles from stretching.
- 7) Press seams to one side. Trim to 12 ½" blocks. Turn in at the Kid's Kwilt table at any meeting.

### DAY RETREATS: Spring and Summer

Held at Box Car's Event Center. It is a large room, but seating is limited so be sure to register early. Our day will start at 9:00 am and end at 7:00 pm. Lunch and dinner will be served, plus games and prizes. An email will be sent out just before the retreat with the seating chart and any last minute information.

April 3-5 - The fee for all 3 days is \$140; for 2 days \$105; for 1 day \$55.
