Julie Cohagan - "The Magic Disappearing Blocks" Trunk Show and Disappearing Block Process.



At this month's Denton Quilt Guild meeting, we'll dive into the idea of the "Disappearing Block". Have you ever seen a quilt block magically transform into something entirely different? That's the beauty of Magic Disappearing Block patterns! This month, we're excited to welcome block magician Julie Cohagan, who will take us on a creative journey through these clever and mesmerizing piecing techniques.

Magic disappearing blocks start with a simple, familiar design—like a nine-patch or pinwheel—but with a few strategic cuts, rotations, and rearrangements, they transform into intricate, unexpected patterns. The result feels almost like sleight of hand, as if the original block vanishes before your eyes, replaced by something completely new.

Whether you're looking for a fresh way to use up scraps or want to add stunning complexity to your quilts with minimal effort, this technique offers endless possibilities. Join us to discover the magic for yourself!

Join us for an evening filled with stories, stitches, and plenty of inspiration! Julie will also be leading a workshop on Wednesday to give us a chance to try a little sleight of hand for ourselves!



2025 Guild Initiative - Pop Stick Blocks

Denton Quilt Guild - 2025 Guild Initiative - Pop Stick Blocks

This year we're making Pop-Stick blocks. Easy peasy black and white blocks with a pop of color. Plus you make two blocks at the same time! Make as many as you like, turn them in at any meeting or at Kid's Bee. A selection of B&W scraps is available at the Kids Kwilt table.

- Make two 13" scrappy blocks, using small to medium scraps of several different fabrics. Two blocks should be
 - One black with white patterns
 - One white with black patterns
- 2) Stack your blocks on top of each other, right sides up
- 3) Using your rotary cutter, make a diagonal slice through Both blocks, but <u>not on the true diagonal</u>, make your cut off center between any two opposing or adjacent sides. It can be a long or short slice. Stay 1" from the corners.
- 4) Cut 2 1 ½ " solid colored strips 3" longer than your slice. These strips should be WOF, not on the bias. Use flat solid or tone on tone fabrics that read as solid.
- 5) Unstack your slices and rearrange so that each block now has a dark side and a light side.
- 6) Align & sew the colored strips between the two opposing sides. Pin to keep the bias edges of the black and white triangles from stretching.
- 7) Press seams to one side. Trim to 12 ½" blocks. Turn in at the Kid's Kwilt table at any meeting.






Renew your membership before April 15 to ensure your details are included in the members section of the new guild directory!

Just go to: twitch.tv/dentonquiltguild. Keep in mind that the Twitch stream is meant for our guild members only — please don't post the link in a public forum.




















































































